05.08.25 APPROVAL OF THE PREVIOUS MONTHLY MEETING MINUTES HELD ON 8 JULY 2025

06.08.25 SOMERSET COUNCIL - COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

- i. Emergency Planning Measures: Somerset Council has <u>suspended normal planning services</u> for at least 12 weeks. During this period, new and straightforward applications will be prioritised. Older or more complex cases will likely face further delays, and planning enforcement will be deprioritised. Site visits will be heavily restricted, and applicants, agents, and councillors will receive standardised holding responses rather than individual updates. The crisis stems from unresolved staffing shortages, IT system integration failures, and a growing backlog.
- **ii. £190 million Transformation Plan:** Somerset Council has approved its delayed "Inspiring Innovation" Transformation Plan, which outlines how the authority aims to save £190 million over five years. A strategic transformation partner will be sought to help develop detailed business cases and support delivery.
- **Pay Review Costs:** Somerset Council has confirmed that its pay and grading review could add up to £8 million to the annual payroll bill by 2026/27, in addition to £3 million already allocated to deliver the review itself using an outsourced partner. At Full Council, councillors questioned the cost and timing of the review given the Council's current financial emergency.
- iv. New Waste Calendars and Food Recycling Push: Somerset residents are receiving updated recycling and rubbish collection calendars which sets out collection days for the next 18 months. While Somerset has one of the highest food waste recycling rates in England, around 45% of food in household rubbish is still discarded in its packaging. The Council and contractor SUEZ will run a year-long campaign to encourage better food waste separation and promote the environmental and cost benefits of using food caddies. Residents can order free kitchen caddies and food waste bins online.
- v. Transport Plan Consultation Opens: Somerset Council has launched a public consultation on its draft Local Transport Plan (LTP), which will guide transport priorities across the county for the next 20 years. The plan outlines goals to promote walking, cycling, and public transport, support the transition to electric vehicles, and improve infrastructure and road safety. It also aims to tailor policies to the needs of different community types, from small villages to large towns. 07.08.25 MATTERS ARISING

- Paddock lease: With Land Registry. Unlikely to be registered until July 2026 due to the i.
- Pavilion lease and future of recreation ground: Cllr Asquith to contact the Directors to arrange a ii. meeting with the Estate.
- iii. Councillor vacancies - Co-option: No one has expressed an interest. At present the parish council is happy to proceed with 9 members instead of 11 so will not be actively looking for new councillors but would consider anyone who does express an interest.
- Fallen tree across path: It is believed that the tree in question has now been removed but a iv. few more have come down since. Anyone finding a tree down, can report it to the Clerk who will find out who is responsible for its removal.
- **Possible increase to the precept:** To be re-visited when the budget is considered later in the year. ٧.
- Future of 5 Alive: Mells PC has put a proposal to the local parishes regarding funding for the vi. magazine to bridge the gap of approximately £1,000/annum. Mells PC has agreed to donate £500, Whatley PC - £150 and Great Elm - £100.
- vii. Litter bin by bus shelter: There is limited room to place a bin directly outside the shelter so an alternative nearby location is being looked at.

09.08.25 **HIGHWAY AND FOOTPATH ISSUES:**

- Speeding vehicles in Vobster: No response from Highways regarding the length of time the survey would be valid for. Clerk to chase.
- ii. **Park Corner:** The rumble bars have not been installed yet.
- iii. Layby by Vobster bus shelter: Around 15 large containers have been dumped in the layby in the last couple of days. Clerk to report. Cllr West is putting together a plan for the infill of the layby which will then be submitted to Highways for approval.
